

## A park expansion that will cost millions

Yet no access coming from the Route de Longwy (RN5) is planned in any way



The expansion of the park in Schouweiler-Sprinkange is an utterly disproportionate project whose cost will have a heavy impact on the municipal budget over several years. The construction of a tunnel under the Route de Longwy (RN5) has been going on day and night for a while now, all to the detriment of the local residents' peace and quiet. The aim of this sped up construction work is to complete it at all costs before the next elections in June 2023. Thus, the politicians chose to deliberately expose the residents of Schouweiler and Sprinkange to multiple nuisances, with a derisory distribution of hearing protection (ear plugs) by the aldermanic College of the Aldermen.

The Biergerinitiativ regrets that the citizens weren't involved in the elaboration of this project, which has exclusively been managed by the College of the Aldermen.

On the other hand, the Biergerinitiativ has asked for the construction of a pedestrian access to the park from the main road (next to the doctor's surgery). We regret to inform you that our proposal was rejected by the municipal authorities. Thus, no access is planned from the Route de Longwy (RN5), which is an incomprehensible thing. Is it a matter of money?

In any case, in the future, anyone going to the doctor's surgery, the gas station or the pharmacy will have no choice but to use the main road.

# An incorrect planning for the expansion of the "Ecole fondamentale"

#### The College of the Aldermen underestimated the number of pupils

The new "école fondamentale" was built rather recently in 2016. Today, its building has already become too small and an annex is currently being built for the children of cycle 1.

According to the initial plans of the local authorities, the old "Spillschoul" building was to be used as an annex for the Maison Relais. However, due to a lack of necessary approval, using the former "Spillschoul" as a Maison Relais in the future it **will no longer be possible**.



Furthermore, the local authorities have completely underestimated the number of pupils attending the Maison Relais.

This means that the commune will soon have to invest in yet another new building to accommodate all the children of the Maison Relais.

For the Biergerinitiativ, the amateurish planning of the LSAP-DP College of the Adermen is obvious, as those currently in charge do not seem to possess even the basic knowledge of multi-annual planning.



### A destruction of our local heritage



The College of the Aldermen has commissioned the construction of a cultural centre for a cost of 8 million € right next to the current town hall in Schouweiler. In the past, a building belonging to the former farm called "Forettenhaus" was located there.

The architect's plans foresaw that this old building should be restored and preserved for future generations.

Despite the promise made to the town council to keep the building in its original state, the College of the Aldermen instead decided to demolish it.

Not only does this show a profound lack of interest in our local heritage, but this example also confirms that the College of the Aldermen constantly goes back on its word.

For the Biergerinitiativ, such behaviour is utterly unacceptable.

#### The Minister and guests had to wait more than 20 minutes

The College of Aldermen invited the Minister of Sport to the grand opening of the new sports hall. While all the guests were present at 10.00 a.m. sharp, there were left waiting.

After a delay of more than 20 minutes, the mayor finally deigned to arrive to cut the ribbon. As is often her wont, the mayor was busy elsewhere! Furthermore, the members of the town council were not included in the official photo.

The Biergerinitiativ voted in favour of the sports hall's renovation, as it is an investment that responds to the needs of the sports associations. Thanks to the commitment of the Biergerinitiativ, a lift for people with reduced mobility was finally included in the project, as the College of the Aldermen had forgotten it.
